
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# Kresge Arts in Detroit Artist Fellowships

In 2017, nine Literary Arts fellowships and nine Visual Arts fellowships will be awarded. Fellowships are \$25,000 no-strings-attached awards, plus professional practice opportunities designed and delivered by Creative Many Michigan. 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# Kresge Artist Fellow's Professional Practice Opportunities

Since 2008 Creative Many has administered the professional practice opportunities for the The Kresge Artist Fellows. The fellowships provide significant financial and professional support to artists annually for emerging and established metropolitan Detroit artists in the visual arts, literary arts, live arts, music and film.

Creative Many's professional practice program encourages the fellows to meet, present their work, brainstorm with colleagues and presenters and participate in formal and informal workshops and seminars.

The program features individual meetings with Creative Many staff, a kick-off retreat, five group workshops and presenter brunches, and validation services (reviewing applications and proposals, providing letters of support and waiving application fees for our Lawyers for the Creative Economy referral program).

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# Lawyers for the Creative Economy

Lawyers for the Creative Economy (LCE) is a Creative Many initiative to establish a statewide network of volunteer attorneys committed to delivering pro bono (free) to low fee intellectual property (IP) and creativity-related legal resources to Michigan-based artists, creative practitioners, businesses/startups and nonprofit organizations.

# Make + Do

Make + Do is a new program focused on strengthening the professional knowledge and expertise of makers and designers in Detroit and Grand Rapids, while sparking cross geographical exchange of tools and ideas.
